The Universal Service Program for Schools and Libraries, most often known as the “E-Rate” program, was established to bring needed modern communications technology to schools and libraries in communities across the country.

Created by Congress as part of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, E-Rate subsidizes between 20% and 90% of eligible costs in four categories:

1. Telecommunications Services
2. Internet Access
3. Internal Connections
4. Basic Maintenance for Internal Connections

Making E-Rate Possible

The Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company administers the program under direction from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

The program’s annual \$2.25 billion budget cap will be indexed to inflation so that the program can more fully meet the needs of students and communities.

Your school’s or library’s discount on eligible services depends on economic need as determined by the National School Lunch Program and the school (or library) location.

After you have determined your eligibility, you will need to select a qualified Service Provider.



E-Rate Eligibility

The E-Rate program is dedicated to impacting the most communities possible, both urban and rural. For example, if at least 1% of your students qualify for the National School Lunch Program, your urban school is eligible for a 40% discount. If 75% or more of your students qualify, your school may receive up to a 90% discount. The most economically disadvantaged communities receive the largest discounts.
