- Unable to connect to VPN when WiFi is disabled but the “Always allow scan (even when WiFi is off)” option in Android settings is enabled
- Hotspot DB update check compares against incorrect timestamp for region-specific hotspot DB's (regional DB publication dates were being compared to the publication date for the main “lapd-access.db” file)

Version 3.0.2 – July 30, 2014

- Fix MDM security policy issue for maximum password age parameter that prevents VPN connection
- Upgrade to OpenSSL 1.0.1h
- Addressed an issue in the client where it was not following HTTP redirects during WISPr processing
- Fix NPE crash in GCMService.onHandleIntent, as reported by Crittercism crash report
- Fix NPE crash in NetworkConnectionReceiver.onReceive, as reported by Crittercism crash reports
- fixed NPE crash in onPreferenceUpdate, as reported by Crittercism crash report
- Update the sysinfo log entry to include the Authentec version in use, or have a message that says "not supported" on devices that do not support Authentec

- Allow Customer Account Administrators to enable VPN Persistent Connection/Auto-Reconnect
- Add support for Mobile Device Management (MDM)

- Add the ability to upload support logs to an AT&T server
- Enhance mobile default service to include SSL-T
- Reduce network traffic by showing About screen initially instead of Software Updates in Help
- Add route table to log before connecting and after connection
- Bug Fix: Ensure proper handling of & (ampersand) in WISPr flows
- Bug Fix: If invalid route specified in ACL, keep trying to connect VPN instead of failing due to exception
- Bug Fix: Address Index out of bounds issue in NativeVpnService
